Nathan Rosen (JD, MLS)

is the creator and administrator of the Law Library Association of Greater New York's group in LinkedIn. He is a knowledge specialist with 25 years of expertise in researching, organizing and distributing information and managing a library, training program and an Intranet. Nathan has both an MLS from Columbia University and a JD from the UMKC. He was the first librarian to be recognized as one of top innovators by Inside Counsel magazine; and was identified as Top Researcher on Wall Street by a book on Super Searchers of Wall Street.

Patricia E. Barbone (MLS)

is currently the Library Director at Hughes Hubbard & Reed LLP in NYC. While a LLAGNY member since the start of her career in law librarianship, she has been active in LLAGNY Board & Committee work for the past seven years. Currently she serves at the Chair of the LLAGNY Placement Committee and prior to that she served two terms as LLAGNY's Treasurer. Prior to joining Hughes Hubbard, she was a reference librarian at law firms Skadden Arps, Shea & Gould, and also worked in the business library of Booz, Allen & Hamilton, a management consultant firm. Patricia received her MLS from Queens College and her BA from SUNY Oneonta.

Ken Strutin (JD, MLS)

is an experienced law librarian, criminal defense attorney, and well-known writer and speaker. He is the author of *The Insider's Guide: Criminal Justice Resources on the Internet*, and has lectured extensively about the benefits of using the Internet for legal research at national and local CLE training programs. Mr. Strutin also wrote ALI-ABA's Practice Checklist Manual on Representing Criminal Defendants, and co-authored the award winning Legal Research Methodology computer tutorial, published by the Center for Computer-Assisted Legal Instruction (CALI). He has contributed chapters to several books and written many articles concerning knowledge management, legal research and criminal law. Mr. Strutin has taught courses in Advanced Legal Research and Law Office Management. He is also listed in *Who's Who in American Law*. Currently, Mr. Strutin is the Director of Legal Information Services at the New York State Defenders Association and writes a column for the *New York Law Journal*.

Patrick Nolan

has been working with technology for over 20 years beginning with his service in the United States Marine Corps. From 2002 - 2007, Pat was an Information Security Specialist with the highly regarded Naval Reactors program. Since January 2007, he has been the Information Security Officer with the Unified Court System's Division of Technology.
