**WHAT IS RSS?**

RSS stands for Really Simple Syndication. Or it stands for Rich Site Summary. Whatever words you use to describe it, RSS is a flexible tool that is gaining popularity as a current awareness and research tool. It is also the technology behind the web phenomenon of Blogging. RSS is also becoming prevalent as an option for disseminating news, managing database searches, and distributing organizational information. If you attend this program, you should get a general understanding of the technology and how it can be an efficient tool to assist you with your research.
