On Thursday, the KREWE invites you to the new and elegant Shaw Center for the Arts for a reception and a stroll through the Louisiana State University Museum of Art Manship Hall featuring an exhibit of works from African-American artists. Friday's event will take you back in time to experience a little of Louisiana's past with Cajun food, music, and dancing at the Rural Life Museum, a living history museum of 19th century plantation life.

The Louisiana Art and Science Museum with its new planetarium will delight children of all ages. The Old State Capitol building features exhibits on Louisiana history and a tribute to Huey Long. The centerpiece of the USS Kidd Veterans Memorial and Museum is a World War II Fletcher class destroyer restored to its 1945 appearance and is open for visitors daily. And of course, for those more daring, the Sheraton is connected to the Belle of Baton Rouge Casino.


