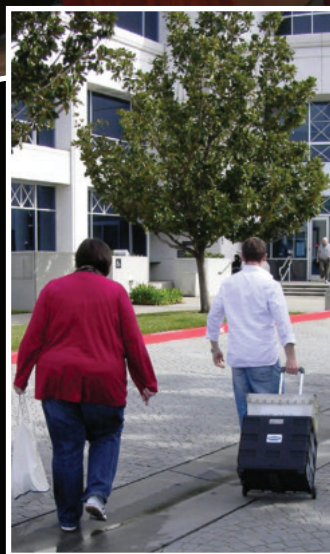

Maureen Cahill, student services librarian, considers the statistical correlation between the number of slices of pizza and student learning outcomes. Photo by Leslie Grove.



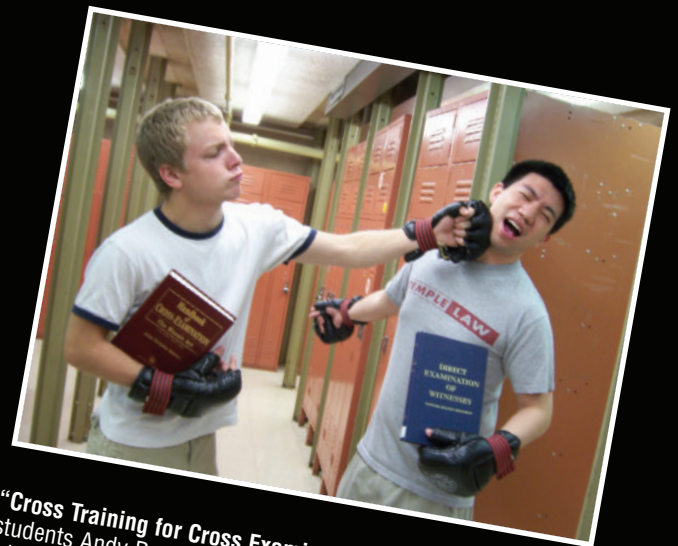
**"Headed for Justice"**
