I created this guide as a summarized description of the Chinese law materials available at our Law Library, both in print and in electronic format. The guide is divided by the different categories of information: country basic information, primary sources, secondary sources, current awareness, citation format, and other research guides. Librarians use this guide to quickly get a sense of the size of the Chinese Law collection in this library; Faculty uses this guide as a starting point for their research in this area; students use this guide as a step by step instruction for researching on Chinese law.

Foreign & Comparative Legal Research Guide Overview

There are many foreign & comparative legal research guides out there. This guide, however, was created specifically for researchers using our library. No specific countries are included. Instead, the guide provides the major sources to start foreign & comparative law research. It provides a brief bibliography on foreign and comparative legal research and it also has instructions on how to search for other books and journal articles on more specific subjects. This guide is tailored for the local community. However, it can also be used for any researcher, as most sources are available elsewhere. I have been using this guide to teach foreign & comparative research seminars.

Intellectual Property Topical Research Guide Overview

This guide was created to provide a list of useful resources for researching on intellectual property law. The guide primarily focuses on the Canadian jurisdiction, while American and international sources are briefly mentioned as well. The guide is intended to be a brief subject bibliography on Canadian intellectual property law, a list of annotated resources, and also an instructional guide on how to use those resources to search for useful information on the subject. This guide has been added to the required reading list for intellectual property law courses offered in the law school by the course instructors.
