<p><b>SUMMARY:</b> This proposed rulemaking would establish procedures for the administration of wilderness areas on public lands that are designated by Congress as part of the National Wilderness Preservation System. This proposed rulemaking would enable the Bureau of Land Management to carry out the congressional direction to manage wilderness areas to preserve their wilderness character. The proposed rulemaking is based on the Bureau's Wilderness Management Policy as published in the Federal Register on September 24, 1982 (49 FR 46777).</p>	<p>Code of Federal Regulations rather than spread them piecemeal among several parts of existing regulations.</p> <p>The proposed rulemaking is concerned primarily with the restraints placed on the public. Certain uses such as mining, mineral leasing and grazing are specifically provided for in the Wilderness Act, and activities related to these uses would also be managed by the Bureau of Land Management.</p> <p>The proposed rulemaking would enable the Bureau to manage these activities to minimize the impact on the wilderness character of the lands, and enable the Director of the Bureau of Land Management or the authorized officer, by directive or order, to impose qualifications or restrictions on such uses as circumstances require and as permitted by law.</p> <p>This proposed rulemaking would have no effect on the process for designating wilderness areas. Further, this proposed rulemaking would have no effect on the jurisdiction or responsibility of the States to manage fish and wildlife on</p>
