Reviewer's Summary:

In this article, Adams compiles succinct reviews, drafted by fellow law librarians, each of which describes resources that their colleagues may wish to consult or utilize as they prepare to provide legal research instruction online. Most of the seven reviewed resources are software programs or applications that legal research instructors can utilize in their online courses, while the others are sites compiling resources for librarians and faculty in higher education who may be new to online instruction. The reviews provide a short description of the resource, comments discussing ways in which law librarians, in particular, may utilize the resource in their instruction, followed by an even shorter summary and recommendation. Reviewed software tools include apps facilitating collaboration among students and instructors, and one tool that identifies accessibility problems in web materials.
