## **AALL Announces 2014 Joseph L. Andrews Legal Literature Award Winners**

Chicago 5/19/2014—The American Association of Law Libraries (AALL) this week officially named the recipients of the 2014 Joseph L. Andrews Legal Literature Award.

The 2014 winners are:

- New York Law Institute Director of Information Technology Ellyssa Kroski, who edited “Law Librarianship in the Digital Age,” published by Scarecrow Press
- University of Minnesota Law Library Special Collections Assistant Barbara Berdahl, who served as principal author of content for the Walter F. Mondale: Spokesman for Reform and Justice in the U.S. Senate website (<http://mondale.law.umn.edu/>); Multimedia Specialist Glen Anderson; Curator of Rare Books and Special Collections Katherine Hedin and Circulation/Reserves Librarian Daniel Matthews, who served as contributing authors.

“I am honored to have been chosen as a 2014 Andrews Award recipient,” Berdahl says. “The contributing authors and I hope the website will serve as a valuable resource for years to come. We are pleased to highlight Vice President Mondale’s pivotal role in key issues prevailing in the United States during the transformative years of 1964-1976.”

Kroski also thanked her contributors. “I truly appreciate being chosen as a 2014 AALL Andrews award recipient,” Kroski said. “This was definitely a group effort, and I really need to thank and give credit to all of the brilliant contributors that made the book possible. The Joseph L. Andrews Legal Literature award recognizes a significant textual contribution—a book, pamphlet, periodical, website, database or other publication—to legal literature. Nominations are measured by their creative, evaluative elements and the extent to which originality and judgment factored into the work’s formation.

The award recipients will be recognized at AALL’s upcoming 107th Annual Meeting & Conference, which will be held in San Antonio, Texas, from July 12-15, 2014.
