MEMORIAL

Carol A. Roehrenbeck was professor emeritus at Rutgers University in New Brunswick, New Jersey. She earned her BA from the University of Delaware, her MLS from Rutgers, and her JD from the School of Law-Newark. Roehrenbeck served as head of public services and a legal research instructor at the law school from 1976 to 1979, then went to Nova Southeastern School of Law where she was director of the library and associate professor of law. In addition to her experience in academic libraries, she has worked for the Federal Reserve Board, the New York Public Library, the Massachusetts Continuing Legal Education Association, and Pennie & Edmonds in New York. She served as a library consultant and as a site inspector for the American Bar Association and the Association of American Law Schools. She has written and published numerous articles and books on topics ranging from legal research to legislative history to blood alcohol evidence. She was a member of numerous professional committees and associations, including AALL, where she became a member in 1969, serving on the Awards Committee from 2009-2011 and on the Copyright Committee from 2005-2007. She passed away December 12, 2022.
