However, in the event of a conflict between the Code and the Session Laws, the Session Laws prevail."</p>	<p>The Maryland Division of State Documents website provides that "[t]his is an official publication of the State of Maryland and is published every two weeks." The websites FAQ section indicates "[t]he online Registers on this web site are reproduced as close to the printed version as possible but may contain errors."</p>	<p>The Maryland Division of State Documents website states that "[u]nder State Government Article, §7-217, Annotated Code of Maryland, the printed version of COMAR is the official and enforceable text. UELMA Adopted	<p>Yes. The Maryland Uniform Legal Materials Act was introduced and cross-filed as Senate Bill 137 and House Bill 165 during the Maryland General Assembly's 2017 Legislative Session. Both bills passed, and the Governor signed the Act on May 4, 2017. The Maryland Uniform Legal Materials Act took effect on October 1, 2017.</p>
