MARIAN GOULD GALLAGHER DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

The Distinguished Service Award, established in 1984, recognizes extended and sustained service to law librarianship, exemplary service to the Association, and/or contributions to the professional literature. The award was renamed for Marian Gould Gallagher in 1990. Gallagher Award recipients are additionally recognized with induction into the AALL Hall of Fame.



Stephen P. Anderson, *Retired*

Ask anyone to name a law librarian associated with Maryland, and chances are they will say “Steve Anderson.” As the longtime (from 2005-2021) director of the Thurgood Marshall State Law Library, Anderson oversaw the management and direction of one of the state’s largest public law libraries at a time when there was increasing demand for providing services to the public, and he succeeded with initiatives such as assuming responsibility for maintaining the People’s Law Library (PLL), a website listing of Maryland legal resources that was created by a number of nonprofit entities. Along with other individuals and groups, Anderson, representing the Maryland State Law Library, helped create the Chesapeake Project in 2006, which preserves digital legal publications of the Chesapeake region.

Anderson’s contributions to AALL are certainly outstanding and sustained. He served as AALL president in 2013-2014 and as executive board member in 2005-2008. He has chaired a total of six national committees and task forces and was the president of the Law Library Association of Maryland (LLAM) in 1999-2000. Among the many well-deserved honors he’s received are the Roy Mersky Spirit of Law Librarianship Award for Public Service, the Government Law Libraries (GLL-SIS) O. James Werner Award for Distinctive Service to Persons with Disabilities, and two AALL presidential certificates of appreciation. Anderson was inducted in the AALL Hall of Fame in 2020. He is also an engaging speaker and noted writer.

Professor Barbara A. Bintliff has had a truly remarkable career. Starting as a law librarian at the University of Denver, she has been director of the law library and professor of law at both the University of Colorado and the University of Texas over the course of her 43-year career. In between, she held visiting professorship appointments at the University of Washington Graduate School of Librarianship and Information Science and at Shanghai International Studies University Department of Law. But Bintliff is not just known by her professional titles. To her legion of law librarian and law school fans, she is also a scholar, teacher, leader, and mentor.

Her service to AALL has been exceptional. A past president of AALL, Bintliff has chaired five national committees, served as chair of the Academic Law Libraries SIS, chair of the Council of Chapter Presidents, and as president of two chapters (Colorado Association of Law Libraries and Southwestern Association of Law Libraries). Her many recent activities include serving as co-chair of the local arrangements committee for the 110th Annual Meeting in Austin, Texas. Among the many honors she's received are the 2007 AALL Spectrum Article of the Year Award, the AALL Robert L. Oakley Advocacy Award in 2012, and two AALL presidential certificates of appreciation. She was inducted in the AALL Hall of Fame in 2012. Bintliff has also been active in many other organizations, including the American Bar Association (she has served on or chaired 22 site accreditation teams); the Association of American Law Schools (she was a founding board member of the section on Law Libraries and Legal Information, and served as chair of the section in 2011). She is also an elected member of the American Law Institute and an elected fellow of the American Bar Foundation.

Carol Bredemeyer epitomizes the word “service.” Over the course of her nearly 40-year career, Bredemeyer has served on an AALL committee for approximately 35 of those years. Bredemeyer’s entire professional career as a law librarian has been devoted to Chase College of Law Library, Northern Kentucky University, where she has been employed in various capacities since 1978. Serving as director since 2018, she plans to retire this summer after having served the University in a variety of capacities, including as president of the Faculty Senate (twice); vice-president (six times); secretary (twice); member of the Faculty Senate (for a combined total of 27 years); and member of five university and law school search committees. For her efforts she was awarded the Faculty Senate Distinguished Service Award in 2019. Bredemeyer has also been praised for her mentorship of students at Chase College of Law and law librarians with whom she has worked or supervised.

Her service to AALL is also notable (and to be celebrated). She served as a member of the AALL Executive Board from 2008-2011. She has chaired six national committees, including the influential Law Student Research Competencies Taskforce in 2011-2012. She was chair of the Reader Services SIS (now RIPS-SIS) in 1987-1988 and served as president of the Ohio Regional Association of Law Libraries in 1992-1993. Bredemeyer has also been a coordinator or speaker on a number of educational programs at the local, regional, and national level, and she authored two articles for *Law Library Journal* (in addition to other publications). For her AALL contributions, Bredemeyer was inducted in the AALL Hall of Fame in 2014.

Michael G. Chiorazzi was a student in Marian Gallagher's last law librarianship class at the University of Washington in 1981. After graduation, Chiorazzi went on to law library positions at Duke University and Boston College before becoming associate dean for information services, director of the law library, and the James & Beverly Rogers Professor of Law at the University of Arizona College of Law Library from 1996-2018 (he also served as professor of information in the University's School of Information). He plans to retire this summer from his current position as associate dean for information services, dean's distinguished director, and librarian professor at the University of Miami Law School.

The author of 22 articles and editor of *Legal Reference Services Quarterly* for 23 years, Chiorazzi is one of the profession's outstanding scholars. He received the AALL Joseph L. Andrews Legal Literature Award (then the Joseph L. Andrews Bibliographic Award) in 2007, the AALL Call for Papers Award in 1987, and the AALL Law Library Publication Award in 1984. He is also a frequent speaker on a wide variety of law library topics. He was inducted into the AALL Hall of Fame in 2012.

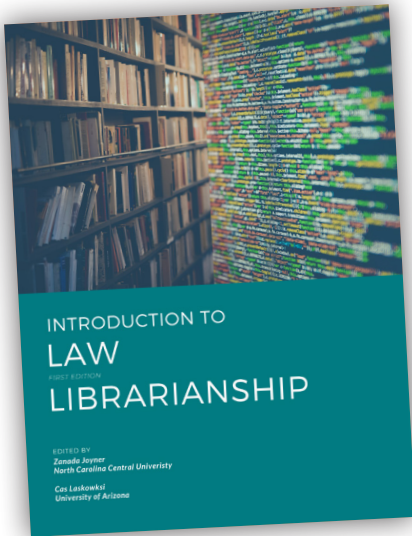
His mentorship of other law librarians (including current and former staff members, and his founding of a law librarian fellows program at the University of Arizona) is perhaps one of his most enduring contributions to the profession. Chiorazzi received the 2013 AALL Distinguished Lecture Award and presented his lecture "Mentoring, Teaching, and Training the Next Generation of Law Librarians: Past and Present as Prologue to the Future" during the 2013 AALL Annual Meeting in Seattle.

Established in 1967 in honor of Joseph L. Andrews, reference librarian at the Association of the Bar of the City of New York, the Joseph L. Andrews Legal Literature Award recognizes significant textual contributions to legal literature.



Introduction to Law Librarianship is a fascinating new contribution to the literature of law librarianship education. Written by a large group of younger law librarians, the book provides prospective law librarians with a modern look into the profession from new perspectives. One of the most significant features of the book is that it has been published as an open source textbook on Pressbooks.com, and it is therefore free to students and can also be easily updated and expanded as desired, making it an ideal textbook for modern times. The book has already been adopted by three library schools with references to its well-written exploration of contemporary topics.

The Bremer-Kovacs Collection: Historic Documents Related to the Administrative Procedure Act of 1946 represents a significant innovation in the world of legal bibliography. The Collection is an online, interactive research tool that is much more than a pathfinder or bibliography, although in many ways it is a thorough one of each. While not quite comprehensive, the title provides multiple routes to accessing the most important documents in the history of the Administrative Procedures Act (APA). There is an exhaustive bibliography of many of the documents that comprise the legislative history of the Act, and the book's interactive timeline feature provides a novel method for providing access to the materials. HeinOnline, too, is to be congratulated for facilitating such an interesting research tool. Combining the bibliography and the interactive timeline provides researchers with a variety of ways to explore the history of the 1946 APA.

Camille Broussard joined the New York Law School Library (NYLS) staff as head of reference services in 1991 and has been director of the library since 2008. Before going to NYLS, she was the collection services and reference librarian at New York University Law Library, and attorney services librarian at the Boley Law Library of Lewis and Clark Law School in Portland, Oregon. Broussard teaches research classes and works closely with faculty members to integrate legal research skills and training into their course work. It is her firm belief that law students who see the contextual connection between the theory and the practice of law will be more prepared to engage completely in the practice of law.

Since becoming a law librarian, Broussard has been active in professional organizations including AALL and the Law Library Association of Greater New York (LLAGNY). She has chaired numerous AALL committees including the Awards Committee and Law Library Journal and AALL Spectrum Committee, to name a few. Broussard was treasurer of the Legal Information Preservation Alliance (LIPA). She has published articles and book chapters and presented programs on teaching, research, social responsibilities, and leadership for AALL, LLAGNY, the Special Libraries Association, the Practicing Law Institute, and library school programs.

Steven Antonio Lastres is a widely recognized expert in innovative information and knowledge management. From 2005 and up until his recent retirement, he worked for Debevoise & Plimpton LLP, which has offices on five continents. Lastres managed a 20-person global department of practice support lawyers; knowledge management specialists; research, business development, and competitive intelligence analysts; and electronic resources staff. He previously held similar positions at other international law firms.

Lastres has held various leadership positions in AALL. He served as editor of *AALL Spectrum* since 2019 and continued to do so into his retirement. He previously chaired the Private Law Librarians & Information Professionals SIS (PLLIP-SIS) and served on numerous AALL committees over the years. Additionally, he was president of the Law Library Association of Greater New York and served on its board for three years.

His professional contributions have not gone unrecognized. He received the PLLIP-SIS Distinguished Librarian Award, Professional Development Award, and Innovative Professional of the Year Award. Lastres also received the International Legal Technology Association's Knowledge Management Professional of the Year Award and the John Jacob Astor Award in Library and Information Science. He was included in the Fastcase 50 for Leadership in Innovation. Most recently, he received the PLLIP-SIS 2022 Hall of Fame Award.

Anne C. Matthewman

Anne C. Matthewman has served on and chaired innumerable AALL committees and special interest sections (SISs). She has also served on the AALL Executive Board in various roles. Perhaps her most challenging responsibility was that of AALL Treasurer from 2001-2004. Shortly after Matthewman began her role, the 9/11 tragedy disrupted the nation's financial systems, and AALL's finances were not immune. Past AALL President Joyce Manna Janto described the situation as follows: "Anne had just taken office as treasurer and working with Steve Ligda, the director of finance and budget, guided the AALL Executive Board through the hard times and helped them make the difficult choices needed to regain our financial position. Instead of the predicted five to 10 years, AALL was back on a firm financial footing within three years."

As if the above service and her full-time jobs were not sufficiently challenging, Matthewman has been highly active professionally in her native Canada. She served as president of the Canadian Association of Law Libraries' for two years, vice president for two years, and held numerous other leadership positions. She also served as president of the Toronto Association of Law Librarians for two years and was on the Board of Directors for seven years at LibraryCo Inc., which is now the Legal Information and Resource Network.

She has been chief law librarian of the Sir James Dunn Law Library at Dalhousie University since 2010. She also held the position of associate dean, libraries—learning and teaching since 2013. Before moving to Dalhousie, Matthewman was library manager/executive director for the Toronto Lawyers' Association from 1987-2010. She began her library career as the librarian for the Essex Law Association and then was a reference librarian at the Chatham Public Library.

Kent C. Olson, *Retired*
Head of Research Services
University of Virginia School of Law
Arthur J. Morris Law Library
Charlottesville, Virginia

Even if you never met Kent C. Olson, you are likely familiar with his exceptional publications on legal research. Many law librarians read his books in law school or library school and have since adopted them as texts in research classes they teach. They also consult these publications to answer obscure or difficult research questions. In time, we feel connected to Olson through his published works.

Olson has written or co-written seven books, including 10 editions of *Legal Research in a Nutshell*. He co-authored the earlier editions with the legendary Morris Cohen, former director of Yale's Lillian Goldman Law Library. Two of his books received AALL's Joseph L. Andrews Legal Literature Award: *Principles of Legal Research* (2009) and *Legal Information: How to Find It, How to Use It* (1999). In addition to books, Olson has published numerous articles and book reviews.

He excelled as a reference librarian and then as head of research services at the University of Virginia. Olson was an early proponent of librarians teaching Advanced Legal Research courses and designed his own course, which he taught from 1993 until 2020. It became a model for other UVA law librarians who later taught the subject. C. Taylor Fitchett, who directed the Arthur J. Morris Law Library from 1998 until 2018, notes that Olson's Advanced Legal Research course, "according to student evaluations, was the best course taught at the Law School."
